Delhi boosts security with 10K cops and anti-drone watch

**New Delhi:**

More than 10,000 police personnel and 3,000 traffic cops, aided by hi-tech surveillance, including under-vehicle systems, FRIS and ANPR cameras, are being deployed in Delhi as the national capital gears up for Independence Day, an official said on Tuesday.

With two days left for Independence Day when Prime Minister Narendra Modi will address the nation from the ramparts of the Red Fort, multiple layers of security will be in place at the historic structure.

Apart from physical deployment, surveillance through CCTV cameras, drone detection systems, and facial recognition technology will be used to monitor the venue and its surrounding areas, a senior police officer said.

For the first time, under-vehicle surveillance systems (UVSS) will be deployed at five parking areas of the Red Fort to scan the underside of vehicles for explosives, weapons or contraband, the officer said.

The technology uses cameras and scanners to detect threats or anomalies, bolstering security at the checkpoints and sensitive locations. The admission to Red Fort on August 15 is strictly through invitation cards and only a few vehicles will be allowed in its vicinity, the officer said.

Fort, while movement in the designated restricted zones will be strictly regulated through access control mechanisms, the officer added.

Apart from multiple security drills, night patrolling and enhanced foot patrolling, plainclothed surveillance teams are being mobilised to strengthen ground presence, especially in the sensitive zones, another officer said.

"Social media platforms are also being closely monitored by the cyber units to detect and neutralise any possible online threats or misinformation campaigns that may disrupt peace," the officer said.

More than 10,000 security personnel and 3,000 traffic cops, including paramilitary forces and special commandos, have been deployed for the Independence Day, police said.

Anti-sabotage checks, vehicle barricading, and verification drives are being intensified in co-ordination with the intelligence agencies, officials said.

Commissioner Singh has also issued an order banning the use of sub-conventional aerial platforms such as paragliders, hang-gliders, UAVs, drones, hot air balloons and other remotely piloted aircraft over Delhi skies between August 2 and August 16.

Dummy bomb exercise conducted at Paschim Vihar market

**New Delhi:**

The Delhi Police on Tuesday carried out a 'dummy bomb' detection and disposal exercise at the National Market in Paschim Vihar West as part of heightened security arrangements ahead of Independence Day, an official said.

According to the police, information was received at the Paschim Vihar West control room about the suspected planting of an explosive-like object at the market. "A team immediately reached the spot, cordoned off the area and began a systematic search."

The officer further said that a headcount spotted the suspicious object during the search. It was examined and later confirmed to be a dummy device placed for the security drill, the officer added.

"The exercise was



aimed at testing the real-time preparedness of the local police and response teams in the event of a bomb threat. Such drills help in evaluating our operational readiness, coordination and response time," he added.

Police said National Market, which attracts a high footfall, was chosen for the drill to ensure

the exercise mirrored a real-world scenario. Market-goers were temporarily restricted from entering the area during the search operation, and the situation was normalised soon after the device was secured.

Security in the Outer District has been intensified, ahead of the upcoming national celebrations on August 15.
