"We have several objections including that the pro tem presiding officer of the MCD is insisting on holding elections for mayor, deputy mayor and members of standing committee all at once. This is contrary to the Delhi Municipal Corporation Act," he had said.

Singhvi had said the other issue is the voting rights of nominated members of the House and it needs to be adjudicated.

The petitioner had moved the apex court on February 7, a day after the MCD House failed to elect a mayor for the third time following a ruckus as the AAP objected to the presiding officer saying that the aldermen nominated by the LG will vote in the election.

Singhvi had sought an urgent hearing of the plea saying that the presiding officer had said that let the nominated members vote despite Article 243R of the Indian Constitution. Agencies

SC upholds the constitution of the J&K Delimitation Commission

During the hearing on December 1 last year, the Centre had told the top court that the delimitation commission formed to redraw the legislative assembly and Lok Sabha constituencies in Jammu and Kashmir was empowered to do so.

Seeking dismissal of the plea, Solicitor General Tushar Mehta, appearing for the Centre, had argued that the Jammu and Kashmir Reorganisation Act, 2019 does not preclude the establishment of Delimitation Commission by the Central government.

On March 6, 2020, Union Ministry of Law and Justice (Legislative Department) had issued a notification in exercise of power under section 3 of the Delimitation Act, 2002, constituting a Delimitation Commission, with former Supreme Court judge (Retd) Ranjana Prakash Desai as the chairperson.

The counsel appearing for the two petitioners, Haji Abdul Gani Khan and Mohammad Ayub Mattoo, had argued that the delimitation exercise was carried out in contravention of the scheme of the Constitution and alteration of boundaries and inclusion of extended areas should not have been done. ED opposes AAP minister Satyendar Jain's bail plea in money laundering

New Delhi:

The Enforcement Directorate (ED) on Monday opposed before the Delhi High Court the bail plea of jailed AAP minister Satyendar Jain in a money laundering case being probed by it.

Jain, arrested on May 30 last year by the agency, is accused of having laundered money through four companies allegedly linked to him.

Additional Solicitor General (ASG) S V Raju, representing ED, argued before Justice Dinesh Kumar Sharma that the AAP leader's stand that there are no proceeds of crime can be "demolished" by the material on record which also shows that he was "in the thick of things".

In its reply filed in the court, the agency said that the bail plea of Jain, a sitting minister, should be dismissed as his release would obstruct further investigation and there is CCTV footage from Tihar jail, where he is in judicial custody, to show that he is an "influential person" who may influence witnesses and frustrate the proceedings.

ED had arrested Jain in the money laundering case based on a CBI FIR lodged against Jain in 2017 under the Prevention of Corruption Act. "Money laundering is crystal clear. Their

case is that Satyendar Jain has nothing to do with it. I have to establish that Satyendar Jain was in the thick of these things," ASG Raju argued before the high court on Monday.

Raju claimed that there is a statement under Section 50 of the Prevention of Money Laundering Act (PMLA) by Jain which also supports the agency's case and there are proceeds of crime of over Rs 4 crore. "I have admission of Satyendar Jain which shows he is a beneficiary (of the companies)," said the senior law officer, adding that the statement of an auditor connected with the companies in question has also established money laundering.

In its reply filed in the case, the ED said that under PMLA, it cannot be said that bail is the rule and jail is the exception and when a public servant commits an economic offence it erodes public confidence as well and has a larger impact on society.

The agency asserted that during investiga-



tion, it was found that the "modus operandi" in the present case involved "transferring cash from Delhi to Kolkata through Hawala operators and in lieu of cash, accommodation entries were layered and received from Kolkata-based shell companies owned by applicant (Jain) and agricultural lands were purchased from these funds. Applicant has denied having any role in taking accommodation entries in his companies".

The reply further emphasised that there is "clear cut evidence" of Jain influencing co-accused Vaibhav Jain and Ankush Jain in Tihar

jail. The "special treatment extended by the prison authorities to Satyendar Kumar Jain shows that the ED's apprehension throughout was correct that being a former minister of prisons and health he is receiving favourable treatment from the prison officials including the prison doctors", it added.

The applicant (Jain) continues to be a sitting minister in the Government of NCT Delhi and has been influencing witnesses through his incarceration. The above facts are borne out from the CCTV video footage of Tihar jail premises submitted by the Direc-

torate before the PMLA special judge," the reply said.

"There is high likelihood that the applicant may attempt to influence witnesses as is also borne out from the video footage where the applicant can be seen interacting with the co-accused on a regular basis. There is a high likelihood that the applicant once released would seek to frustrate the proceedings under the Act," it added.

The ED also submitted that Jain has been non-cooperative with the probe and has given evasive replies.

The court listed the case for further hearing on February 21.

Satyendar Jain has earlier submitted that no case is made out against him and he has fully cooperated in the investigation and there is no requirement to continue his incarceration after filing of charge-sheet. The AAP leader has challenged the trial court's November 17, 2022 order by which his bail plea was dismissed on the ground that he was prima facie involved in concealing the proceeds of crime. Besides him, the trial court had also denied bail to two co-accused -- Vaibhav Jain and Ankush Jain -- saying that they "knowingly" assisted Jain in concealing the proceeds of crime and were "prima facie guilty" of money laundering.

The trial court had said "prima facie" Jain was "actually involved in concealing the proceeds of crime by giving cash to the Kolkata-based entry operators and thereafter, bringing the cash into three companies... against the sale of shares to show that the income of these three companies was untainted one".

In 2022, the trial court also took cognisance of the prosecution complaint (chargesheet) filed by the ED against Jain, his wife and eight others, including the four firms, in connection with the money laundering case.

TN judge S Karthik delivers the fastest trial and Judgement in Tamil Nadu

Kodaikanal:

The Tamil Nadu saw today a speedy trial and Judgement in just eight days. A case on attempt of Rape against two criminals in Kodaikanal, Tamil Nadu. The two accused were sentenced 8 years Imprisonments and 20000 each penalty. The judgment delivered by Judge S Karthik in the Judicial Magistrate No.II, Kodaikanal. It seems that it is the fastest judgment in the history of Tamil Nadu.

A Criminal case under .44/2023 u/s 341, 294(b), 323, 354(A) IPC & Sec.4 of TNPHW charged against two accused Jeeva and Balamurugan in Kodaikanal on accusation of attempt to rape a woman, according to Sub Inspector of Police, Kodaikanal, the trial came under judge each by Thiru.K.Karthik, M.L., Judicial Magistrate No.II, Kodaikanal, Dindigul District. The judge, after the trial awarded sentence the two accused for 8 years and eight months each of the accused under various section and also imposed penalty of Rs



2000 each.

The accused were intercepted a Scorpio car driven by a woman at kookaal area indumban Karai, Kodaikanal and got on the car. The tried to molest the woman, while on resisting, the used filthy language against the woman. When passerby noted the incident raised alarm. The two accused then ran away from the Spot.

A case was filed by The Sub Inspector, Kodaikanal Police Station, Kodaikanal against the two accused on 4th February 2023. The accused taken into custody. The trial came under Thiru.K.Karthik, M.L., Judicial Magistrate No.II, Kodaikanal today. After trial, the learned judge, Confirmed the accusation

and sentenced 8 years and eight months under u/s 341, 294(b), 323, 354(A) IPC & Sec.4 of TNPHW. The learned judge opined while delivering judgment that there should be strict sentence against crime on women. Only the harsh punishment will bring down the crime against the woman in the country.

Earlier, a POCSE court in Bihar's Araria district has sentenced a man in just one day's proceedings to life imprisonment for raping an eight-year-old girl. "This is perhaps the first case in which punishment has been given in a single day of trial. Before it, in Datia (MP) district, a court had delivered a verdict after three days of trial on 8 August, 2018. Bihar made a national record by conducting trial in a single day by giving life sentence to the convict till his last breath."

The today's Kodaikanal case is the fastest trial and judgement case by delivered by Hon'ble Judge S Karthik in the Judicial Magistrate No.II, Kodaikanal on attempt to rape case.
