May extend odd-even scheme, Delhi people want it: Kejriwal

New Delhi

As pollution levels in the national capital hovered close to emergency levels on Wednesday, Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal said the odd-even road rationing scheme could be extended beyond November 15.

He appealed to opposition parties, which have termed the scheme an "election stunt" of the AAP government, to shun their resistance to the scheme.

"Pollution has increased drastically. All of Delhi is demanding Odd Even and at such a time the Opposition should support the people's wish," he said.

The scheme, implemented from November 4, is to end on November 15.

"If the need arises, we will extend it (odd-even scheme)," Kejriwal said in response to media queries on whether the initiative aimed at curbing vehicular pollution will be extended.

Delhi-NCR gasped for breath on Wednesday as the noxious smog resulting from raging farm fires and unfavourable weather pushed pollution levels in the region towards the "emergency" zone for the third time in 15 days.



Kejriwal blamed stubble burning in neighbouring states for repeated episodes of smog in Delhi and said it has hit Delhi's image worldwide.

"I remember German Chancellor Angela Merkel was in Delhi a few days ago ... when a public health emergency was declared. What kind of image of Delhi she must have carried to her country?" he said.

The chief minister said Delhi's neighbouring states, especially Haryana and Punjab, are burning crop residue disregarding strict directions from the Supreme Court.

"The air quality oscillated between the good and moderate categories in the early part of this season because of our continuous efforts to check pollution. But it deteriorated due to the intrusion of stubble plume from Punjab and Haryana," he said.

"The number of farm fires reduced in between due to rains in Punjab and Haryana. It led to a decline in Delhi's pollution. The incidents of stubble burning have shot up again. These states are not even following the Supreme Court's directions. Delhi people are suffering because of it," he said.

Kejriwal reiterated that paddy straw can be used to produce compressed natural gas and coal which will also increase the income of farmers.

"I have met many experts. I am myself an engineer. Stubble can be converted into CNG. The foundation stone of an industry that can convert paddy straw into

Delhi's healthcare system at par with privately-owned, the rich visiting Mohalla Clinics: Kejriwal

Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal on Wednesday said that even rich people, who can afford treatment at private hospitals, are visiting Mohalla Clinics run by his government and this showed their faith in Delhi's healthcare system.

Kejriwal inspected the first Mohalla Clinic opened by the Delhi government in the upper-middle-class Hemkunt Colony in Greater Kailash-I, and asserted that the government healthcare system in Delhi is at par with the private sector.

He met patients and the staff during his inspection and enquired about the level of satisfaction among patients with the facilities

provided at the Mohalla Clinic.

The chief minister also got his blood pressure measured by a doctor.

"Never before have people had such faith in government services. Even in posh colony in Greater Kailash, Mohalla Clinics are a hit," he said.

"I am so glad that all of you have faith in government hospitals. Earlier, people used to presume that government hospitals would not be good enough. All the Mohalla Clinics are in very good condition and are well maintained" he said interacting with the local residents.

Kamal, a Chirag Enclave resident, said it was her first visit to a Mohalla Clinic

and she had a pleasant experience at the facility.

"When those who can afford expensive private hospitals start using government services as a matter of choice, it's the biggest certificate of quality. At a posh GK colony, I found upper-middle-class residents using a Mohalla Clinic. They're very very satisfied. Could you have imagined this few years ago?" Kejriwal tweeted after the inspection.

The Delhi government has set an ambitious target of 1,000 mohalla clinics for its flagship Aam Aadmi Mohalla Clinic project. There are 302 Mohalla Clinics in the national capital serving as primary healthcare centres.

Britain's Prince Charles on Wednesday visited the India Meteorological Department (IMD) and was briefed about the early warning weather forecast system, especially on the prediction of cyclones.

IMD Director General Mrutunjay Mohapatra said Prince Charles spent nearly 45 minutes at the IMD's National Weather Forecasting Centre, which is the focal point during cyclones.

He was explained about how cyclones are predicted with the use of tools like radars, satellites and Doppler radar.

Mohapatra said the visiting dignitary also asked about cyclone 'Bulbul', which hit West Bengal early this week.

"We informed him that the IMD also provides weather warnings to neighbouring countries," the IMD DG said.

Later, he also paid obeisance at Bangla Sahib Gurudwara here.

Prince Charles was escorted by members of the gurudwara. Following the tradition, he covered his head with a scarf and paid obeisance.

He was presented with a 'kirpan' by Delhi Sikh Gur-



dwara Management Committee president Manjinder Singh Sirsa.

He also did 'sewa' and helped in preparing chapattis in the 'langar' or community kitchen area and interacted with the devotees.

Prince Charles, who arrived here on Wednesday, is on a two-day visit to India.

This is his 10th official visit to the country. During the visit, he also met President Ram Nath Kovind at the Rashtrapati Bhavan.

The focus of his visit would be on enduring the UK-India ties and shared global challenges such as sustainability and climate change.

Man held at Delhi airport for smuggling gold worth Rs 33 lakh

New Delhi

A 57-year-old man has been arrested at the airport here for allegedly trying to smuggle in gold worth about Rs 33 lakh, a customs official said on Wednesday.

The accused was intercepted after his arrival from Bangkok on Tuesday.

A detailed personal and baggage search of the passenger resulted in the recovery of 937 grams of gold, valued at Rs 32.38 lakh, which were concealed in the pockets of his black colour jacket, said Kalrav Mishra, the deputy commissioner of customs at Indira Gandhi International (IGI) airport.

The gold was seized and the accused was arrested, he said.

The passenger also admitted to having smuggled in 2.5 kg of gold in his past five visits.

"Thus, the total value of the offending good comes out to be Rs 1.18 crore," Mishra said.

Toddler crushed to death after crawling on road, driver flees with vehicle

A two-year-old boy was crushed to death by an unknown speeding vehicle after he crawled on road in east Delhi's Preet Vihar on Tuesday night. The victim's head was crushed under the wheels of the vehicle and he was died on the spot, the Police said.

However the driver fled on the spot with the vehicle leaving the boy dying.

The boy was taken to nearby hospital where the doctors declared him brought dead.

The incident was reportedly took place at around 8 pm on Tuesday when boy Priyansh (8) crawled outside from his house and reached towards the road. Suddenly, a speeding unknown vehicle passing from there run over on him and fled, Police said.

Victim's father Mohan told the police that he was taking dinner inside the room when his only son crawled from there and reached on road. "I heard a sudden loud sound and rushed out leaving my dinner on table. I found my son in a pool of blood with

critical head injury. Soon after my landlord came out and we immediately taken him to hospital in landlord's car but the doctor declared him brought death," Mohan told the Police.

Mohan (26) had recently migrated from Bihar's Sitamadh district to Delhi for work. He was working as "Gate Man" in a Bungalow in C-block, Preet Vihar and residing along with wife and son in the servant quarter of the same house, the Police said.

DCP east Delhi Jasmeet Singh said that this is a case of hit and run and a case under appropriate sections has been registered at PS Preet Vihar. "The vehicle and its driver have not been traced. AAP leaders, MLAs to observe Dhoka Diwas against BJP's promise of regularising unauthorised colonies

Senior AAP leaders and party MLAs will observe 'Dhoka Diwas' on Saturday to protest against BJP's "false promise" to regularise unauthorised colonies.

Calling BJP's announcement to regularise unauthorised colonies an "election gimmick", senior AAP leader Gopal Rai said the BJP's intentions are "not genuine".

"To tell people about how they are being cheated by the BJP, we will observe a Dhoka Diwas on Saturday. Our senior leaders, party MLAs will also join in to tell people living in unauthorised colonies how the BJP is cheating them and regularising unauthorised colonies is a false promise," he told reporters.

Rai said they will raise General secretary while addressing at Tamoor Nagar in Delhi.

Delhi has 1797 unauthorised colonies which account

In October, the Union Cabinet approved a proposal to grant ownership rights to people living in unauthorised colonies in Delhi.

Housing and Urban Affairs Minister Hardeep Singh Puri has said the Centre would also bring a bill in the Winter Session of Parliament to give relief to the residents of unauthorised colonies in the national capital.

The move has come ahead of assembly polls in Delhi, to be held early next year.

The decision is applicable to 1,797 identified unauthorised colonies spread over 175 square km inhabited by people from lower-income groups, Puri said last month.

Outdoor activities remain suspended in Delhi schools as air quality nears 'emergency' zone

Outdoor activities in Delhi schools remained suspended on Wednesday as unfavourable weather conditions pushed the pollution levels in the city towards the "emergency" zone for the third time in the last 15 days.

However, there was no word on whether the city schools will be closed again as the air quality is predicted to further deteriorate.

Early this month, the Delhi government shut all schools for four days after a Supreme Court-mandated panel declared a public health emergency in the Delhi-NCR region in the wake of rising pollution level.

The schools reopened on November 5 after the air quality had improved.

"What's the use of being a

developing country if our children are not permitted to breathe in clean air...Must think seriously about solutions as soon as possible before any emergency occurs," a Twitter user posted on the microblogging site.

Parents also took to social media requesting that schools be closed.

"We understand schools cannot be indefinitely closed but at least on severe air quality days they need to be closed. My son has been coughing ever since he got back from school," another twitter user shared.

At 11.30 am, Delhi's overall air quality index read 454. Jahangirpuri and Rohini were the most-polluted areas with an AQI of 483 each, followed by Mundka (479) and Bawana (479).
